AGGIES EXPECT A FAST HIGH SCHOOL TRACK MEET

NORTON CAPTURES AGGIE HIGH MEET, TOPEKA 6TH

Collier, Marquette Sprinter, Breaks Two Records.

Other Marks Fall Before Speedy Athletes—Smalley, Wear, Rogers and Bruce Topeka Point Winners.

Manhattan, Kan., May 8. - Norton won the fifth annual state high school track and field meet on College field this afternoon, with 21 points. Collier, of Marquette, placed his school second for point honors by taking firsts in three events he entered.

Wichita took third with 12 points, and Enterprise and Belle Plaine tied for fourth honors with 11 points each. Topeka and Pratt tied for fifth with 10 points each and Wamego came sixth with 8.

The other point winners were: School of Agriculture, K.S.A.C. 7, Alta Vista 7, Onaga 6, Sedgwick 5, Cimarron 5, Emporia 1, Meriden 1.

Collier, of Marquette, was the most brilliant performer of the meet, winning the century and two-twenty dash after four heats of the fifty in which he bested the 5 3-5 seconds record twice in preliminaries. Winning the 100-yard event in 10 1-5 seconds, Collier clipped one-fifth second off the time made by Butler, of Hutchinson, on the local track in 1913. Collier also broke the 220 record of 24 flat, held by Wey, of Wichita, made in 1912.

Casey, of Norton, and Axline, of Pratt, were close contenders for second point honors. Axline took first in the pole vault and broke the record one inch by winning from Knostman, of Wamego, at 10 feet 11 inches. In the running broad jump Nelson, of Belle Plaine, drew first with a good leap of 21 feet 2 ¼ inches, and by capturing points in the dashes was well up in the running for point honors. The relay, which was run for a special cup and not for points towards winning the meet, was captured by Pratt, when Axline passed Sink, of Mankato, in the last twenty yards of the race and won out by a scant margin. Pratt's time was 3:42 2-5.
