## **86 Schools in Meet**

### **State Event to Have at Least 388 Contestants**

Emporia, Kan, May 11.—Eighty-six Kansas High Schools have entered 388 contestants in the twelfth annual track and field meet of the Kansas State High School Athletic association which will be held at the Kansas State Normal school next Saturday. Two hundred contestants entered the meet at Manhattan last year. J.C. Grover, of Kansas City, will act as chief starter and referee.

### **Best High Track Talent In State Here Saturday**

The Best high school track talent in the state will compete on the Normal field Saturday. Beginning in the morning, preliminaries will be run and boys who place in the preliminary heats will enter the finals in the afternoon.

Medals will be awarded athletes who place in each event. The medals will be furnished by the Normal. A large cup will be given the team making the largest number of points, by the state high school athletic association.

All races, with the exception of the distance events will be run in heats. The 440 dashes will be run, each counting places toward total points. The half-milers and milers will run against time. More than 100 men are entered in the half-mile race.

More than 620 high school athletes have entered from 85 Kansas high schools. The meet is by far the largest ever held in Kansas. Emporia is host for the first time since the meets were started 11 years ago. Manhattan has had the meet for 11 years.

## **BREAKS MILE RECORD**

The record in the mile was broken this afternoon in the state high school meet on the Normal field. McDonald, of El Dorado, ran the mile in 4 min 35 sec., clipping 2 3-5 seconds off the record McDonald made last year. J. Kuck, of Wilson broke the state shot put record with a throw of 50 feet, 2 ¼ inches.

## **HIGH SCHOOL STARS BREAK NINE RECORDS AT STATE MEET**

Nine State records were broken in the annual high school state meet at the Normal Saturday afternoon. The day was perfect for the meet and the track was fast. Although more than 600 athletes were entered in the meet. The events went off smoothly and the relay was over before 6 o'clock.

Haviland won the meet with 27 ½ points, and was awarded a large loving cup. El Dorado was second with 22 points. Ford was third with 14 points, all made by Riegle. Mulvane took fourth place with 11 points. Cimarron and Salina tied for fifth place with 10 points each. Following are the other scores: Winfield 8; Burns 6 1/3; Chanute 6; Elmdale 6; Mayette 6; Wilson 5; Bendena 4 ½; Spring Hill 4 ½; Norton 4; Dickenson County 3; Hillsboro 3; Wichita 3; Augusta 2; Cheney 2; Council Grove 2; Lyons 2; Neodesha 2; Williamsburg 2; Dodge City 2; Humbolt 1 ½; Little River 1; Manhattan 1; Marion 1; Oskaloosa 1; Chase County 1; Clay County 1; Pratt 1/3; Valley Falls 1/3.

Riegle, the lone athlete from Ford, was the star of the meet. He carried off the individual high point honors by scoring 14 points. Bryant of Haviland; was second with 13 points. Riegle of Ford, and McDonald of El Dorado each broke two records.

The track was crowded for the distance races. Two races were run in the 440 dash. Thirty-two runners lined up for the mile.

### **Notes of the Meet**

McDonald of El Dorado, broke two records. He set new marks in the 880-yard and mile runs. McDonald ran the mile in 4 min. 35 sec. lowering his old record made in 1930 by 2 2-5 seconds. He ran the half in 2 min. 14-5 sec. lowering the old record by 3 1-5 seconds. He was pushed in the mile, but won the half by a wide margin.

Romine of Ashland, led the first lap of the mile in 63 seconds, Wells, of Chanute, led the second lap at 2 min. 15 sec. In the final lap, McDonald led out, closely by Kimport, of Norton, who too second. McDonald won the race by 10 yards.

Riegle, a junior in the Ford rural high school, carried away individual honors when he smashed two records in the discus throw and broad jump and tied for first place in the pole vault. He was high point man in the meet with a total of 14 points. Riegle threw the discus 120 feet 5 inches. He jumped 21 feet 7 inches or 1 inch farther than the previous high school record. He also cleared the bar in the pole vault at 11 feet, 7 ¼ inches. Riegle has made an enviable record in track this year. In no single meet, other than the state meet, has he made less than 18 points. He is the only official entrant from Ford County High School. Riegle was captain of the football team last year. He weighs 165 pounds and is 19 years old.

John Kuck, of Wilson, is the undisputed champion of high school shotputters of Kansas. Kuck shoved the 12-pound pellet 48 feet, 8 inches. And then because he was not satisfied with that mark, he put the iron ball 50 feet, 2 ¼ inches. The last throw was made in exhibition with five officials watching and will be counted as a record. Kuck is 16 years old. He is a sophomore in the Wilson High School. He has played football on the high school team each of his two years in school. "I've practiced with the shot some ever since I was in the upper grades." Said Kuck.

Joseph Grinnell, of Mayetta High School, a full blooded Pottawatomie Indian boy, made all of the entrants sit up and take notice in the shot put and discus events. Grinnell won second place in the shot and discus against a field of more than 50 entrants. His shot put was 45 feet, 6 inches and his discus throw was 120 feet, 5 inches.

Hurling the javelin a distance of 180 feet, 11 inches, Melvin Oakes, an 18 year old high school boy from Cimarron, smashed the former state college and high school records. Oakes threw the javelin 27 feet, 3 inches farther than the state high school record and 10 feet, 11 inches farther than Kansas Conference record. Oakes also took first place in the 120-yard high hurdles in 16 4-5 seconds, or 4-5 seconds better than the state record. He scored a total of ten points in the meet and was third in individual points. Oakes was the only contestant from Cimarron High School. He is a senior.

## HAVILAND STATE WINNER

### Nine Records Broken in Annual Event at K.S.N. Field

Emporia, Kan, May 13.—Nine records were broken in the annual state high school track meet here today. Haviland won the meet, with 27 ½ points. El Dorado was second, 22; Ford, third, 14; Mulvane, fourth, 11.

Riegel, lone athlete from Ford high school, was individual star. He scored 14 points and broke two state records. McDonald, of El Dorado, also broke two records
