TRACK

Greater changes were made in the conduct of track activities the past year than in any other sport. An attempt was made to institute a system that would provide for a gradual elimination of contestants until the very best representatives of the various sections of the state should contest for honors at the state meet. In the first place, approximately seventy-five county, league, and invitation meets were approved as qualify meets for state sectional meets. The winners of the first two or three places in each event were permitted to enter the sectionals. Eight sectional meets were held in the various parts of the state, in which the winners of the first three places in each event qualified for participation in the final state meet. The plan seemed to work exceptionally well. It establishes the state sectional meets as important events in the athletic program and eliminates poor athletes from the state meet program. The only criticism received so far—and it seems to be a valid one—is that the plan breaks up individual school teams too early in the season by eliminating those who do not qualify in preliminary meets from representing their schools further. This objection can be well overcome by lengthening the track season one week. Under this arrangement the state meet would be held the third Friday and Saturday in May and the sectional meets the week previous.

Some extraordinary records were made in the sectional meets, and the state meet was the classiest meet the association has ever conducted. There were approximately 200 contestants at Emporia, all of whom had placed high in the sectional meets. The new relay events were attractive features and provided an opportunity for many additional boys to compete.

Coach H. W. Hargiss was the referee and starter at the state meet and the general management was under the direction of Coach F. G. Welch. The meet was well conducted and all events were run off under satisfactory conditions. Facilities of the Emporia Teachers College were used.

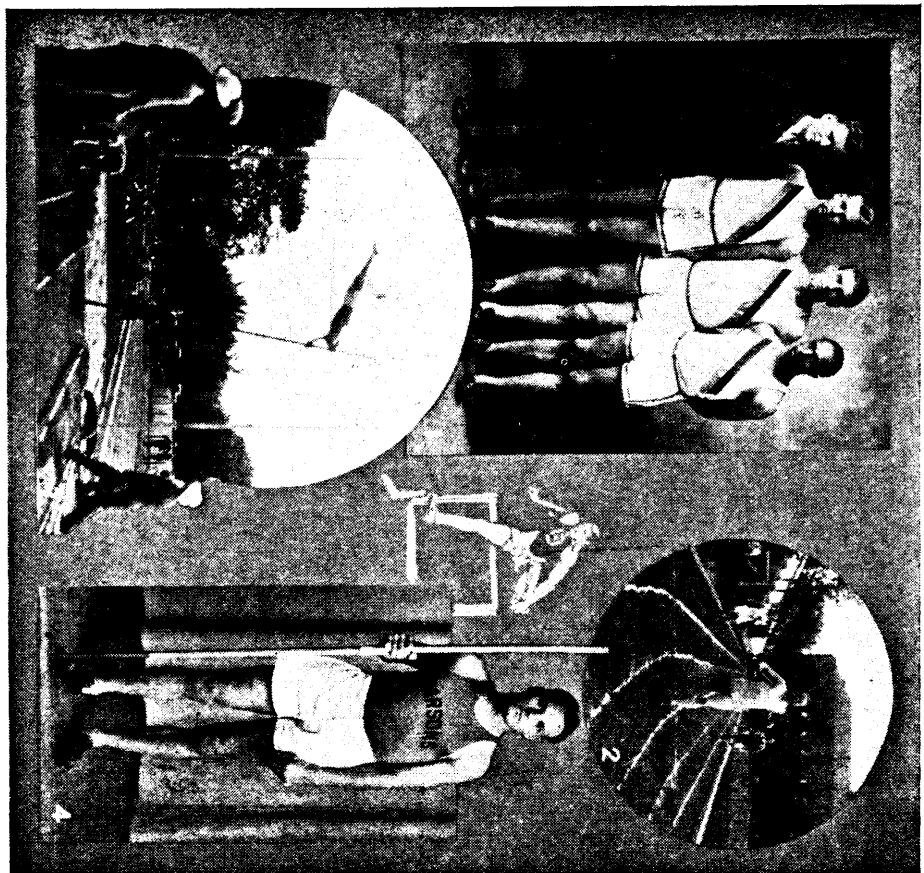
In the 1927 state meet nine new records were established. Although most of these were exceptional, five new marks were registered in the 1928 meet.

THE 1928 MEET

Hutchinson High School won the 1928 state track meet, scoring a total of 21 1/2 points. Marion was second with 20 points, Wichita and Chase County tied for third with 11 points each, and Wyandotte finished fifth with 9 1/2. New records were established by Holder of Marion in the 100 yard dash, by Madison of Hutchinson in the high jump and broad jump, by Walton of Parsons in the javelin throw, and by the Wyandotte one mile relay team. The 50 yard dash was dropped from the program and the half mile and medley relays were added. Wichita won the half mile event and Hutchinson the medley.

A GROUP OF TRACK STARS

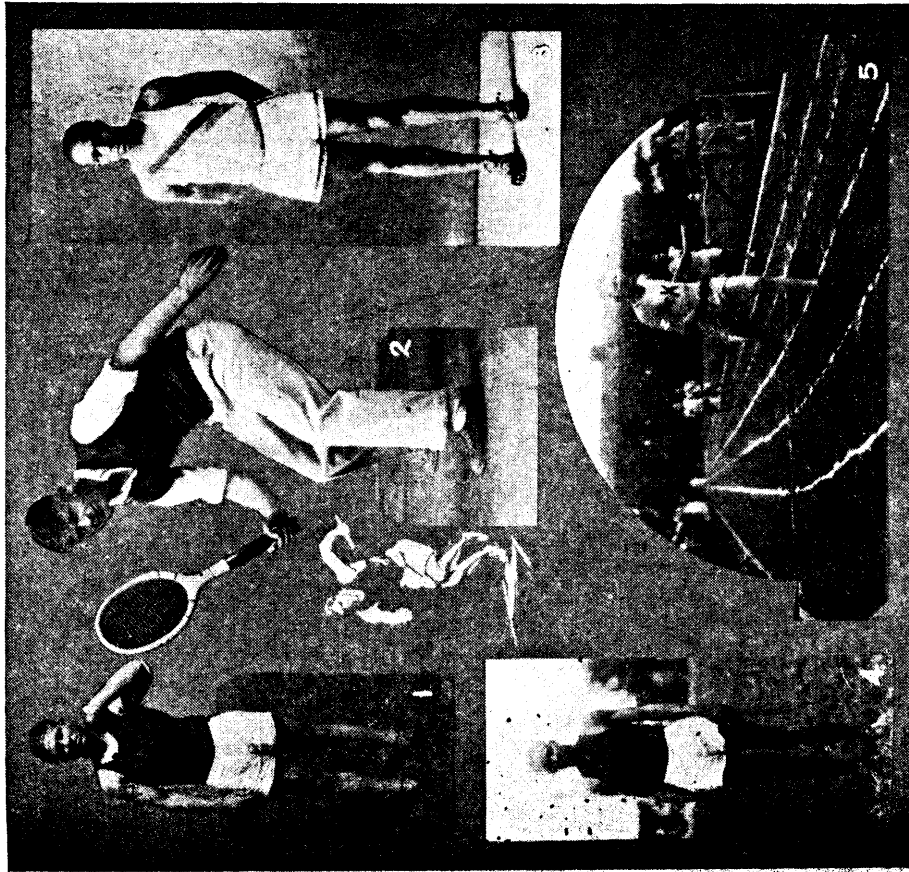
The boys in this picture made some remarkable records in track the past season. (1) The Marion High School track team and their coach. From left to right—Richmond, coach; Ehrlich, winner of second place in the high jump at both the state meet and the Chicago University invitation meet; Siebert, winner of the 440 and of second place in the 220 at Emporia. He also won third in the 440 at Chicago; Holder, who holds the state 100 yard dash record and won fourth in the 220 at Chicago. (2) Johnson of Wichita bringing in the baton to win first place for his team in the 880 yard relay at Emporia. They won third place in the same event at Chicago. (3) Coffman of Ford winning the pole vault at the state meet. He vaulted 12 feet 8 inches at Chicago, winning second place. (4) Walton of Parsons who broke the state javelin record with a heave of 184 feet ½ inch. He also won first place at the Chicago meet.

(1) Riggs of Chase County High, winner of first place in the shot at both the state meet and the Chicago University meet. 51 feet 9 1/2 inches was his mark at Emporia. (2) Dalton of Independence High, the state tennis singles champion. He won from a classy field of contestants at the state tournament. (3) Holder of Marion High, who broke the state 100 yard dash record this year. His time was 9.9 seconds. (4) Madison of Hutchinson High. He contributed two new state records this year, setting marks of 6 feet 3 inches in the high jump and 22 feet, 5 inches in the broad jump. (5) Wyandotte High School finishes first in the mile relay, setting a new record of 3 minutes, 33 seconds.
