### Examination for Officials

All registered football and basketball officials are required to take examinations on the rules in each sport.

Copies of the football test have been mailed to all registered officials for that sport. Answer sheets must be sent to Association headquarters not later than October 1. They will be graded and returned.

Cooperation in sending these in early will save much time and will assist in avoiding errors. It will also help in eliminating the necessity of sending additional notices.

### Send Cash for Rule Books

When ordering rules books, cash of 25¢ for each book ordered should be enclosed with the request. This applies especially to any order for less than four books. It will facilitate the handling of these requests if the necessity of billing is eliminated.

### Student Transfer Certificates

Principals are required to use Student Transfer Certificates for all transfer students who intend to take part in any interscholastic activities. The ordinary transcript of grades does not provide all essential information in regard to interschool participation, broken semesters, etc.

It should be noted that students must meet eligibility requirements in all interschool activities.

### Approval by Both Schools

In selecting officials for football and basketball games, schools should make certain that their opponents are in agreement. Both schools are privileged to approve officials before they are engaged.

### Conferences Must Be Approved

Principals should make sure all conferences and other events for high school students have been approved by the Executive Board of the K.S.H.S.A.A.

Last year information was received at Association headquarters which indicated some yearbook conferences had been held which were not approved.

If in doubt, contact the Association regarding all approved conferences and activities.

### Opening Date for Basketball Practice

Principals and basketball coaches are reminded of the regulation on the opening date for basketball practice.

Schools participating in football shall not start organized basketball practice until their football season is completed, or on November 10. If the football season is over before November 10, basketball practice may begin the day after the close of the football season. Schools completing their football season after November 10, may start basketball practice on November 10. If a school does not participate in football, basketball practice may start any time after the opening of school. Working with individual boys by giving coaching instruction is considered to be "Organized Practice" and is not permissible prior to the opening date for practice.

### First Basketball Game

All schools may now play their first basketball game the last Friday in November provided it is not earlier than November 27. If the last Friday in November is earlier than November 27, the first basketball game may not be played until the first Friday in December.

### Football Cleats Must Be Legal

Attention of football coaches and officials is called to the equipment rule in regard to shoe cleats. Shoe cleats longer than 7/8 inch or one whose sides are concave or whose free end is not parallel with the base or is smaller than 3/8 inch in diameter, if conical, or 1/4 by 3/4 inches, if oblong, are illegal.

Officials should check cleats, especially when the game is to be played on a muddy field, to see that they are legal.

### Send Tournament Applications

District and regional basketball tournament application forms will be sent to all schools. Those interested in sponsoring one of these tournaments should forward their application to the K.S.H.S.A.A.

Tournament assignments to the district centers are to be made by December 1, so tournament centers must be selected early and teams assigned before the season opens.

### Wyandotte, Haskell and Sylvia New State Track Champions

Wyandotte and Haskell completed undefeated seasons by annexing the Classes AA and A State Track and Field Meet championships held at Kansas State University, Manhattan, on May 20 and 21. Wyandotte used balanced team strength to ward off the defending Class AA Champion Wichita East team 36 1/2 to 32 1/7. Haskell, led by their sprint star Gary Sarty, walked off with the Class A title by scoring 25 points to 16 for second place Wakeeney. Sylvia's one man team, Jerry Kinnamon, won the Class B 100, 220 and 440 yard dashes to score all of his teams 15 points. Cheney and Tribune tied for the runner-up honors in Class B with 11 points.

In spite of a steady drizzle and biting cold wind, the Friday preliminaries were run off in precision fashion. All hopes for any new track marks were "drenched" as the track became a quagmire. However, Larry Berger of Jetmore cracked the 18-year-old Class B discus mark with a toss of 158' 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ ". This was the only new mark established on Friday.

Through the cooperation of "Old Man Sol" and an efficient grounds crew the track was in near perfect condition for the finals held Saturday afternoon. Darrell Gwinner of Ellsworth, Elsbery Broadnax of Topeka, the Coldwater medley relay team and Wichita East's mile relay team took advantage of the fast track to equal or better the state records in the Class A 220 yard dash, AA broad jump, B medley relay and the AA mile relay, respectively. Wichita East's Class AA mile relay team record of 3:24.2 shattered the previous mile relay record, for any class, by one second.
