## Topeka, Medicine Lodge and Kinsley 1963 State Track and Field Champions

The 1963 State Track and Field Meet held May 17 and 18 at the University of Wichita provided a close team race in Class A for Medicine Lodge, but Topeka and Kinsley experienced little difficulty in capturing the AA and B titles.

Topeka attained its fourth state title by overwhelming its two nearest competitors, Wichita East, defending champion and winner of two successive state championships, and Wyandotte (K.C.), by 16 points. Topeka's other state championships were in 1916, 1948 and 1956.

The AA champions accumulated 30 points and were led to victory by its crack 880 and mile relay teams and star sprinter Andy Williams, who finished first in the 220 yard dash and second in the 100 yard dash.

Medicine Lodge accumulated 25 points in winning its first state championship but had to come from behind and place third in the final event, the mile relay, to overtake a fine Hoisington by one point. Herington was a close third with 20 points. Bob Newsom sparked the Medicine Lodge team to victory by amassing 11 points in the dashes. Bill Kimble of Hoisington was a triple winner with impressive victories in the 100 and 220 yard dash, and the 180 yard low hurdles.

Kinsley crushed all competition by scoring 23 points. Second place St. Francis scored 12 points. Sprinter Lon Floyd and high jumper Kenny Gaines provided the big push for the Class B victors, who won their first state championship.

In all, eight state records were broken in the 1963 meet. The outstanding achievement of the day, and one of national stature, was that of sophomore Jim Ryun of Wichita East, who ran the mile in 4:16.2. Ryun's performance broke the record of 4:19.1 set by Archie San Romani of Wichita East in 1959. ## Wichita Kapaun and Victoria Win State Baseball Championships

Kapaun High School of Wichita captured the AA-A championship at El Dorado and Victoria the B title at Great Bend in the state baseball tournaments held May 17 and 18. This was the first state baseball crown for both Kapaun and Victoria.

Kapaun squeezed by Wyandotte 3-2 for the championship in a prolonged 11-inning contest. Kapaun had previously defeated Great Bend 3-0, and Wyandotte had barely nipped Wichita West 1-0 to gain their respective rights to the state finals. Wichita West nudged Great Bend 4-2 to gain third-place honors.

Victoria had very little trouble at Great Bend in attaining their first state championship by defeating Wilson 14-6 in the climactic championship game. They had previously defeated Wetmore 13-2 in the semifinals. Wilson reached the finals by squeaking by Uniontown 1-0. Uniontown defeated Wetmore 7-3 to gain third place.

All teams qualified for the state tournament through regional play. Class AA-A regionals were held at El Dorado, Great Bend, Wyandotte (K.C.), and Wichita West. Windthorst (Spearville), Chetopa, Lucas, and Rossville were hosts to the Class B regionals. Winners of first place in each regional qualified for the state tournament.

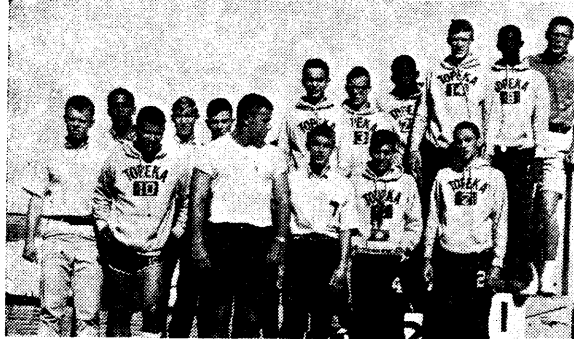
## Wichita Southeast, Salina, Abilene and Caney Win Golf Titles

Golf championships were divided among four schools in the state golf tournaments held May 17 and 18. Top honors at the Grass Greens Tournament held at Clapp Memorial Park in Wichita went to Southeast's four-man team, Salina's two-man team and Kapaun's (Wichita) Grier Jones, medalist. The Abilene four-man team, Caney's two-man team and medalist Steve Olsen of Abilene walked off with the championships at the Sand Greens Tournament held at Marion.

The Wichita Southeast four-man team of Bob Igo, Steve Storey, Dick Horner, and Kent Carter were closely pressed by neighboring Wichita East as they won the championship by two strokes in shooting a combined score of 597 strokes. Andy Nusbaum and John Haase of Salina won the two-man grass greens championship by a comfortable margin of 14 strokes over Wichita East, their nearest competitor. Andy Nusbaum was a member of the 1962 two-man team champions, medalist in 1961, and was co-medalist this year but was defeated in a sudden death play-off by Grier Jones of Kapaun after both had shot a highly respectable 140.

In the Sand Greens Tournament at Marion, Gary Olson, Jim Jordan, Steve Olsen, and Ron Gibbs of Abilene, handily won the four-man golf crown by defeating Ellis for second place by 17 strokes. Caney, last year's four-man winner, won the two-man competition, as Mike Scimeca, and Kent Notestine combined their ef-

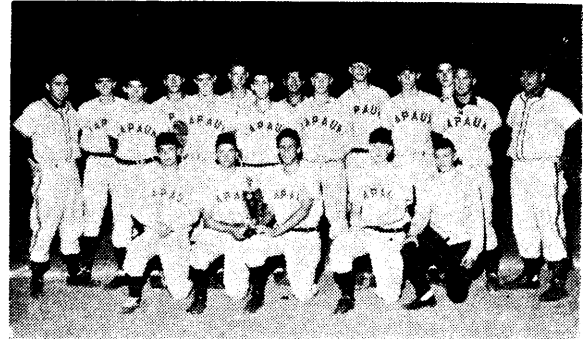
